




Welcome to Mamita's Garden.

Where should the water go?


Mamita needs to water her plants but she can't figure out which hose to use! *Help Mamita by finding the hose that connects to the faucet.*

These are the colorful steps that lead to Mamita's garden. *Color the mosaic tiles using the color guide on the left.*






Search for the WORD!

Many different plants, creatures, tools, and other items are scattered all around Mamita's garden. *Can you help her find them?*




























Which comes first?

She lives and works in Pasig City with artist husband José Santos III and their three boys.



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
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
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
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
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
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
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




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
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
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
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
